4 Months, 3 Weeks and 2 Days
winner of the 2007 Cannes Film Festival Palme d'Or

Cincinnati World Cinema is proud to present the first-run screening of **4 MONTHS, 3 WEEKS AND 2 DAYS**, at 7 pm on **Tuesday July 22**, and **Wednesday July 23** at the **Cincinnati Art Museum**.

Masterful, moving, heartbreaking and intense, **4 Months, 3 Weeks and 2 Days** was released nationally in February, 2008, after its premiere at the New York Film Festival the preceding September. This is a film noir about two people drawn into a secret, illicit world below the surface of everyday society – a suspense thriller as ingeniously crafted as any Hitchcock movie.

Featuring powerful performances by Anamaria Marinca and Laura Vasiliu in the lead roles and impeccably shot by Oleg Mutu (*The Death of Mr. Lazarescu*), the film is directed by Cristian Mungiu. The post-film discussion will be led by film critic Steve Rosen and CWC director Tim Swallow.
