## Four local film professionals to lead post-film discussions

Cincinnati World Cinema will present the LunaFest Film Festival, on Tuesday January 27 and Wednesday January 28 at the Cincinnati Art Museum. The screenings are at 7:00 pm each evening, followed by audience discussion facilitated by local film professionals. Tickets are \$8.00 for students and Art Museum members, \$10.00 for the general public and a portion of the proceeds will benefit the Breast Cancer Fund, LunaFest's founding partner.

Selected from roughly 600 entries, the ten LunaFest short film winners offer exceptional storytelling, creative delivery, powerful messages and that intangible quality that conveys a bit of magic; with universal themes that deal with love, relationships, family, self-perception, gender, health and aging. This will be the fourth annual presentation of LunaFest by Cincinnati World Cinema.
