LAST STOP FOR PAUL is a contemporary cross between a Crosby-Hope road movie and a Harold & Kumar adventure. The plot is centered on Charlie and Cliff, two 30-something co-workers who bail out of Los Angeles to take Cliff's friend Paul around the world. One small wrinkle: Paul is dead and the objective is to spread his ashes in as many exotic locations as possible as the pair make their way to the famous Full Moon Party in Thailand.

As they backpack around the world, Charlie and Cliff do what any two young guys on the road would do -- see the sights and look for parties and romance. They meet some wacky people, have some close calls with disaster, party when they can, find interesting women, a bit of sex and romance and a lot of beautiful scenery and share some unbelievable adventures that change their lives forever.

Armed with a high-end digital camera, two microphones and three batteries, writer/director Neil Mandt and cinematographer Marc Carter shot the film in 20 countries on five continents, including Jamaica, Chile, Senegal, Egypt, Greece, the UK, Germany, Russia, Japan, Vietnam and Thailand.

Winner of 45 film festival awards, **LAST STOP FOR PAUL** is a fast-paced adventure film with ample doses of romance, comedy and friendship that will make you want to grab your best friend and set out to see the world.
